

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

AIR TRANSPORTATION: ARC/IATAN jet economy class, round trip from gateway city applicable on all IATAN and ARC carriers, based on the non-refundable fare. Tours must be fully paid for and tickets issued no later than 60 days before the tour's departure date. If you cancel or change your reservation for any reason after tickets have been issued, a cancellation fee of 100% of the ticket price will be charged by the airline. Fuel Surcharges: We will review the air costs approximately 65 days before departure and notify you of any changes in air fuel surcharges or taxes. Deviations: Deviation requests should be in writing and will incur an additional service fee plus any applicable fare increases.

LAND TRANSPORTATION AND TRANSFERS: By private deluxe motor coach.

ACCOMMODATIONS: Tour prices are per person, based on two persons sharing double or twin-bedded rooms with private bathroom with tub or shower. Single rooms subject to availability and an additional cost of \$2,875.00 (tour participants without a roommate will have to pay the single room surcharge). Hotels used are Deluxe category.

MEALS: Breakfast and dinner daily. Coffee or tea included with breakfast only; all other beverages are extra.

BAGGAGE: Subject to change, free baggage allowance is governed by the airline on which you are flying. Baggage allowance guidelines will be included in your final documents. Excess baggage will be charged at the established rates. Due to limited motor coach capacity we urge our tour members to carry only one bag per person. Porterage for one checked bag is included in the tour price. Excess baggage charges from the airlines and motor coaches are the passenger's responsibility and will be collected at time of handling.

SERVICE CHARGES AND TAXES: Those normally levied by hotels and restaurants are included and all departure taxes and tipping.

NOT INCLUDED: Passport costs, and health documentation costs (when required); food and beverages (including coffee and tea) not usually included with regular table d'hote meals; optional sightseeing tours and excursions; accident, baggage and trip cancellation insurance; transporting and handling excess luggage; tips to persons rendering special services not specifically mentioned as included; items of a purely personal nature such as laundry, telephone and cable expenses, internet access, room service orders, etc.; transportation between hometown city and gateway city.

INSURANCE: Acting only as agents for suppliers, Wilcox World Travel and Tours, Div. of Wilcox Travel Agency, Inc., is not responsible for damage, loss, or theft of luggage and/or personal belongings, or for personal injury, accident and/or illness. For protection, it is important that you have adequate insurance to cover these possibilities. We recommend Allianz Travel Insurance. Travel protection is available to all residents of the U.S. and Canada, and includes cancellation protection, coverage for lost luggage, medical emergencies and more. Guests booking this tour have the option of purchasing and may request at time of booking. Fee must be included with initial payment. Details will be provided with written confirmation of your tour reservation.

IMPORTANT PASSPORT INFORMATION: A valid passport is required and must be obtained in person by each tour member at a local passport office. Passports must have an expiration date beyond November 9, 2021 in order to travel with this tour. If your expiration date is inside this date, you must renew your passport in order to participate.

VISA: A visa is not required for US citizens traveling to Israel or Italy,

however, a visa IS required for travel to Jordan and the cost has been included in your tour price. Further instructions will be provided approximately 90 days prior to your departure.

DEPOSITS AND PAYMENTS: A deposit of \$500.00 per person is required immediately. Installment payments are accepted and updated statements will be forwarded with each payment sent. The balance is due no later than 60 days prior to departure. Please check your statement for specific due dates. Tour conditions and airfares are subject to Governmental, ARC/IATAN, and airline regulation requirements in effect on the date of and during the tour. All airfares and land rates are quoted in US Dollars and are based on tariffs and cost in effect July 2020 and are subject to change without notice. Land costs are based on group rates and final tour cost may be dependent on number of tour participants.

GUESTS WITH DISABILITIES: Please be aware that certain land tours may not be fully accessible to persons with disabilities. Wilcox World Travel and Tours must be notified of any special medical, physical or other requirements of passengers at the time of booking. Should a passenger require the assistance of another to make this tour, it is the responsibility of that passenger to arrange for a companion to provide the assistance at all times and for the entire duration of the tour.

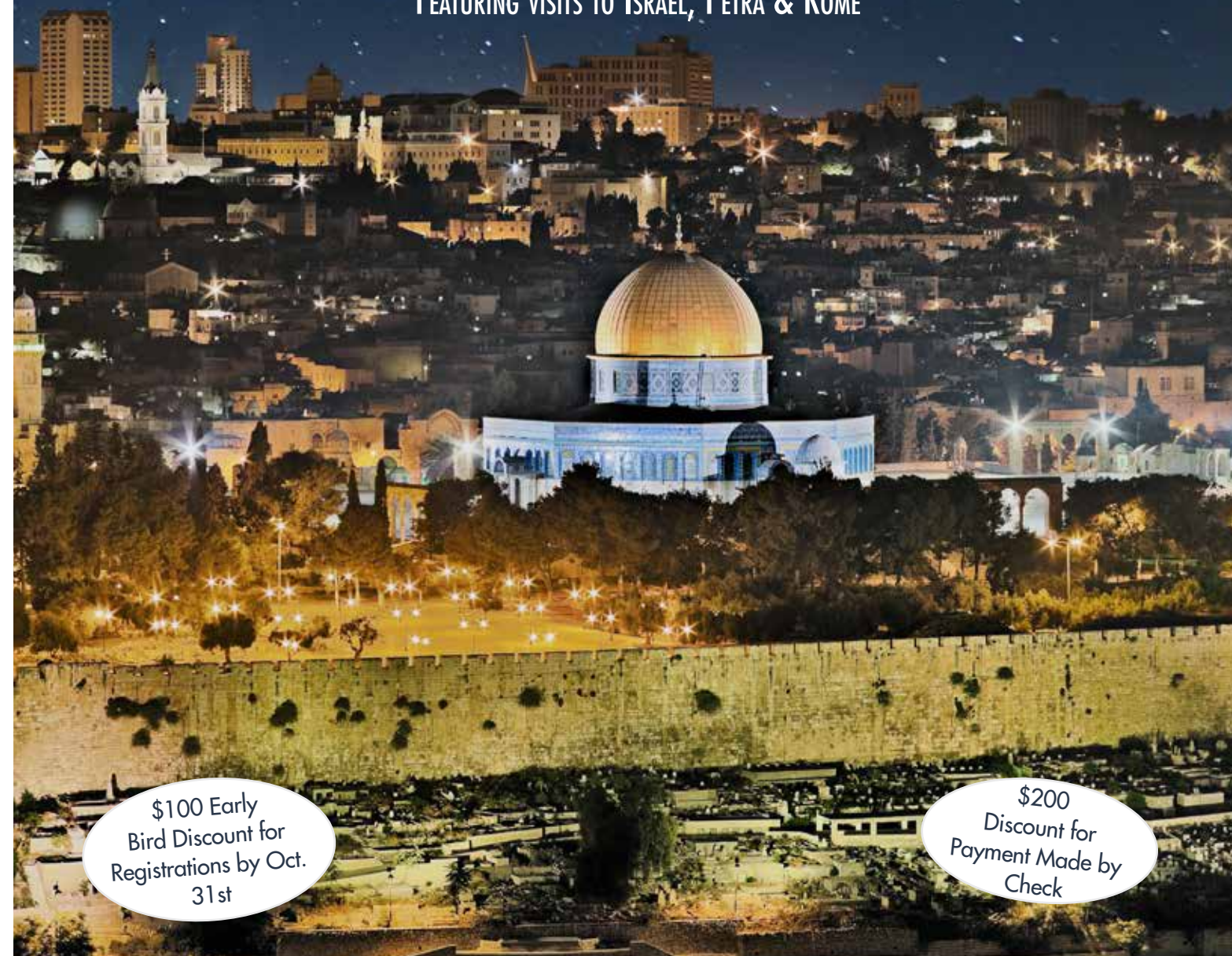

DAY BY DAY ITINERARY

DAY 01 – SUN. APR. 25 - DEPART CLEVELAND FOR ROME

We begin our tour of a lifetime with a late morning departure from Cleveland. We connect in Newark with other travelers for our late afternoon flight to Rome Fiumicino airport via United Airlines.

DAY 2 – MON. APR. 26 – ROME

We are served dinner and breakfast on our overnight flight and arrive Rome early morning. We enjoy the “glory that was Rome” as we tour some of the famous landmarks like the Forum, the Mamertine prison, Arch of Titus & the majestic Coliseum before we head for dinner and overnight at the beautiful Westin Excelsior Hotel.

DAY 3 – TUE. APR. 27 – ROME



We begin our full-day of touring this great city with a stop at the Vatican Museum & Sistine Chapel, where we see works by Rembrandt & Michelangelo. We marvel at the majesty of St. Peter's, then turn our attention to the Spanish Steps, Pantheon, & Trevi Fountain before we return to our hotel for dinner and overnight.

DAY 4 – WED. APR. 28 – DEPART ROME / ARRIVE TEL AVIV

Following an early wake-up call, our El Al flight departs for Tel Aviv and arrives mid-afternoon. Upon arrival we clear passport control, meet our guide and transfer by private motor coach to our hotel in Tel Aviv for dinner and overnight at the Carlton Beach Hotel.

DAY 5 – THU. APR. 29 – BEERSHEBA / EILAT

We begin this day with a visit to Beersheba, where Abraham first made his home. We visit the ruins on the tel, the well dating to Abraham's time that has survived until today, and even the cistern. Then we head into the Negev desert to visit the majestic Ramon Crater at Mitzpe Ramon. After lunch, we marvel at how Christ fulfilled the symbols in the sacrificial system described in Leviticus as we visit the Wilderness Tabernacle. Our day concludes with dinner and overnight on the Gulf of Aqaba at the beautiful Herod's Palace Hotel.

DAY 6 – FRI. APR. 30 – BORDER CROSSING / PETRA / BACK TO ISRAEL

In the early morning, we depart Eilat, cross the border, then drive to Petra, the ancient Edomite and Nabatean capital, and “Rose Red City half as old as time.” We'll see the spectacular “city of the dead,” with its famed gorge, ancient streets, temples, dwelling places and tombs carved in solid rock. Our visit

includes a two-mile walk through the famous Siq (the natural gorge) to arrive at the Treasury. We see the Nabatean Judgement Hall, palace tombs, famous Urn Temple and the Roman Amphitheater. A climb of several hundred steps to the “high places” might appeal to the adventurous. We return to Israel for late dinner and overnight in Eilat.

DAY 7 – SAT. MAY 1 – EN GEDI / MASADA / DEAD SEA

We enjoy a relaxing departure from Eilat and head to Masada where we ride the cable car to enjoy the remains of Herod's palaces, a synagogue, storehouses, siege ramp and a majestic view of the Dead Sea. A walk down the snake path might appeal to a few as we return via cable car and depart for En Gedi. Here we see the Ibex, the deer of Psalm 42, and reflect on David's encounter with King Saul (1 Samuel 24), before we turn to the Dead Sea for a late arrival at Herod's Dead Sea Hotel for dinner & overnight.

DAY 8 – SUN. MAY 02 – QUMRAN / JERICHO / GAN HASHLOSHA / BET SHEAN / TIBERIAS

We begin the day at Qumran to discover the significance of the Dead Sea Scrolls. Then we head for the tel of Jericho – a favorite spot for archaeologists & the oldest excavated city in history. Jericho is also an excellent location to buy world-famous Hebron pottery. Following a stop for shopping and lunch, we enjoy an excellent view of the Mount of Temptation, then proceed north along the Jordan Valley for the incredible ruins of Beit Shean, featuring eighteen layers of civilization where Saul and his sons were nailed to the city wall (1 Samuel 31). We then depart for Gan Hashlosha, near Gideon's Spring, which feeds the Jordan for our baptism in late afternoon. Dinner and overnight at the U Boutique Hotel in Tiberias.

DAY 9 – MON. MAY 03 – AROUND THE SEA OF GALILEE

Our day begins with a memorable boat ride on the Sea of Galilee. Our bus climbs into the Golan Heights where we arrive at the base of Mt. Hermon. Baniyas, the Caesarea Philippi of the Bible, is a main water source for the Jordan River. Here Peter made his great declaration about Jesus (Mk. 8:27ff). After lunch, we follow some of the stories in Mark 4-6 about the ministry of Jesus. Our stops include the Mt. of Beatitudes where Jesus gave the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5-7). We move on to Capernaum, our Lord's hometown for two years (Matt. 4:13), and marvel at multitudes that were attracted to the miracles performed by Jesus. We may include a brief stop to commemorate the feeding of the 5,000 (Matthew 14). We conclude the afternoon with a stop at Magdala, a recently excavated 1st Century fishing village & home to Mary Magdalene. Return to our hotel for dinner and overnight.

DAY 10 – TUES. MAY 04 – NAZARETH / MEGIDDO / CARMEL RANGE / CAESAREA BY THE SEA / ISRAEL MUSEUM / YAD VASHEM



An early walk along the shore provides a spectacular memory of sunrise over the Sea of Galilee. After breakfast, we head to Nazareth, the boyhood home of Jesus to visit the Church of the Annunciation. Later this morning we stop at the tel of Megiddo, one of Joshua's victories, which dates to 4,000 B.C. We drive through the Carmel mountain range, where Elijah fought the

prophets of Baal (1 Kings 18:1-40). After lunch, we stop at Caesarea by the Sea, the majestic seaport built by King Herod. Then we ascend the hills of Judea to Jerusalem where we stop at the Israel Museum, housing the Model of Jerusalem from the time of the Second Temple. The museum also houses the Shrine of the Book, which depicts the discovery of the Dead Sea Scrolls. We turn our attention to Yad Vashem, the Jewish Holocaust museum, which reminds us of the atrocities of World War II before we head to the Inbal Hotel in Jerusalem for dinner and overnight.

DAY 11 – WED MAY 05 – TEMPLE MOUNT / POOLS OF BETHESDA / TEMPLE TREASURES INSTITUTE / CITY OF DAVID / SOUTHERN STEPS / ROCKEFELLER ARCHAEOLOGICAL PARK

An early wake-up call means we ascend the walkway to the Temple Mount and learn about the holy sites of Islam at the Al Aqsa Mosque and Dome of the Rock. The history of this area includes Abraham's sacrifice of Isaac (Genesis 22), Solomon's temple (1 Kings 5 & 6), Herod's temple, the visits of Jesus and Paul's arrest. We arrive at the Pools of Bethesda, where Jesus healed a lame man recorded in John 5. We move on to the Temple Treasures Institute to view artifacts for building the next Temple and enjoy lunch on the streets of the Jewish Quarter, perhaps near the Cardo - the reconstructed main street of Roman Byzantine Jerusalem. Then we walk down the steps to visit the holiest site to Jews today called the Western or Wailing Wall where we see the massive foundation stones. We cross the street to observe recent archeological work at the City of David, then walk the Pilgrim's Path, recently discovered as the passageway for Jewish faithful ascending from the Pool of Siloam to the Temple Mount with sacrifices. We conclude the day with a visit to the Southern Steps where Jesus performed miracles and where the Church was born. Dinner and overnight at the hotel.

DAY 12- THU. MAY 06 – BETHLEHEM / HERODIAN / EIN KAREM / MT. ZION / HOUSE OF CAIAPHAS / UPPER ROOM / TOMB OF KING DAVID

We start the day in Bethlehem at the Church of the Nativity and remember the moment when the Son of God took a human body and became one of us (Luke 2:1-7). We turn our attention to the Shepherds' Fields and the Herodian and contemplate the contrast between the earthly riches of King Herod and the poverty of our Lord (Philippians 2:5-11). We enjoy shopping and lunch in Bethlehem, then move on to Ein Karem, the home of John the Baptist, before we conclude the day with visits to Mt. Zion, the House of Caiaphas, the Upper Room and the Tomb of King David. Dinner and overnight at our hotel.

DAY 13- FRI. MAY 07 – GORDON'S CALVARY / THE GARDEN TOMB / MT. OF OLIVES / GARDEN OF GETHSEMANE / VIA DOLOROSA / CHURCH OF THE HOLY SEPULCHRE

Our last day in Israel begins with a visit to Gordon's Calvary and the Garden Tomb for communion and worship. We then drive to the top of the Mount of Olives. What a breathtaking view! With the city of Jerusalem spread out below, you will feel the Biblical stories come alive. We walk down the hillside to the Church of All Nations,



“the Basilica of Agony,” adjacent to the Garden of Gethsemane, a beautifully kept olive garden featuring trees nearly 2,000 years old. We return to the crowded streets of the Old City and follow the Via Dolorosa,” the Way of Sorrows,” to the Church of the Holy Sepulchre. We conclude the day with options like shopping, a visit to the Citadel, where Herod's palace stood, or a walk along the rampart for a spectacular view of the Old City. A farewell dinner at the Ambassador Hotel awaits us before returning to Ben Gurion airport for the overnight flight back home..

DAY 14 – SAT. MAY 08 – ARRIVE USA

We arrive early this morning at the Newark airport and transfer to our domestic flights home filled with life-changing memories of our visit to the Holy Land.
