

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

AIR TRANSPORTATION: ARC/IATAN jet economy class, round trip from gateway city applicable on all IATAN and ARC carriers, based on the non-refundable fare. Tours must be fully paid for and tickets issued no later than 60 days before the tour's departure date. If you cancel or change your reservation for any reason after tickets have been issued, a cancellation fee of 100% of the ticket price will be charged by the airline. Fuel Surcharges: We will review the air costs approximately 65 days before departure and notify you of any changes in air fuel surcharges or taxes. Deviations: Deviation requests should be in writing and will incur an additional service fee plus any applicable fare increases.

LAND TRANSPORTATION AND TRANSFERS: By private deluxe motor coach.

ACCOMMODATIONS: Tour prices are per person, based on two persons sharing double or twin-bedded rooms with private bathroom with tub or shower. Single rooms subject to availability and an additional cost of \$1,850.00 (tour participants without a roommate will have to pay the single room surcharge). Hotels used are Deluxe category.

MEALS: Breakfast and dinner daily. Coffee or tea included with breakfast only; all other beverages are extra.

BAGGAGE: Subject to change, free baggage allowance is governed by the airline on which you are flying. Baggage allowance guidelines will be included in your final documents. Excess baggage will be charged at the established rates. Due to limited motor coach capacity we urge our tour members to carry only one bag per person. Porterage for one checked bag is included in the tour price. Excess baggage charges from the airlines and motor coaches are the passenger's responsibility and will be collected at time of handling.

SERVICE CHARGES AND TAXES: Those normally levied by hotels and restaurants are included and all departure taxes and tipping.

NOT INCLUDED: Passport costs, and health documentation costs (when required); food and beverages (including coffee and tea) not usually included with regular table d'hote meals; optional sightseeing tours and excursions; accident, baggage and trip cancellation insurance; transporting and handling excess luggage; tips to persons rendering special services not specifically mentioned as included; items of a purely personal nature such as laundry, telephone and cable expenses, internet access, room service orders, etc.; transportation between hometown city and gateway city.

INSURANCE: Acting only as agents for suppliers, Wilcox World Travel and Tours, Div. of Wilcox Travel Agency, Inc., is not responsible for damage, loss, or theft of luggage and/or personal belongings, or for personal injury, accident and/or illness. For protection, it is important that you have adequate insurance to cover these possibilities. We recommend Allianz Travel Insurance. Travel protection is available to all residents of the U.S. and Canada, and includes cancellation protection, coverage for lost luggage, medical emergencies and more. Guests booking this tour have the option of purchasing and may request at time of booking. Fee must be included with initial payment. Details will be provided with written confirmation of your tour reservation.

Please note: Israel will require all tourists to have travel insurance that includes coverage for lockdown, isolation quarantine, and hospitalization as a result of Covid.

IMPORTANT PASSPORT INFORMATION: A valid passport is required and must be obtained in person by each tour member at a local passport office. Passports must have an expiration date beyond April 28, 2023 in order to travel with this tour. If your expiration date is inside this date, you must renew your passport in order to participate.

VISA: A visa is not required for US citizens traveling to Israel. **JORDAN EXTENSION:** A visa IS required for travel to Jordan and the cost has been included in your tour price. Further instructions will be provided approximately 90 days prior to your departure.

DEPOSITS AND PAYMENTS: A non-refundable deposit of \$500.00 per person is required immediately. Installment payments are accepted and updated statements will be forwarded with each payment sent. The balance is due no later than 60 days prior to departure. Please check your statement for specific due dates. Tour conditions and airfares are subject to Governmental, ARC/IATAN, and airline regulation requirements in effect on the date of and during the tour. All airfares and land rates are quoted in US Dollars and are based on tariffs and cost in effect December, 2021 and are subject to change without notice. Land costs are based on group rates and final tour cost may be dependent on number of tour participants.

GUESTS WITH DISABILITIES: Please be aware that certain land tours may not be fully accessible to persons with disabilities. Wilcox World Travel and Tours must be notified of any special medical, physical or other requirements of passengers at the time of booking. Should a passenger require the assistance of another to make this tour, it is the responsibility of that passenger to arrange for a companion to provide the assistance at all times and for the entire duration of the tour.

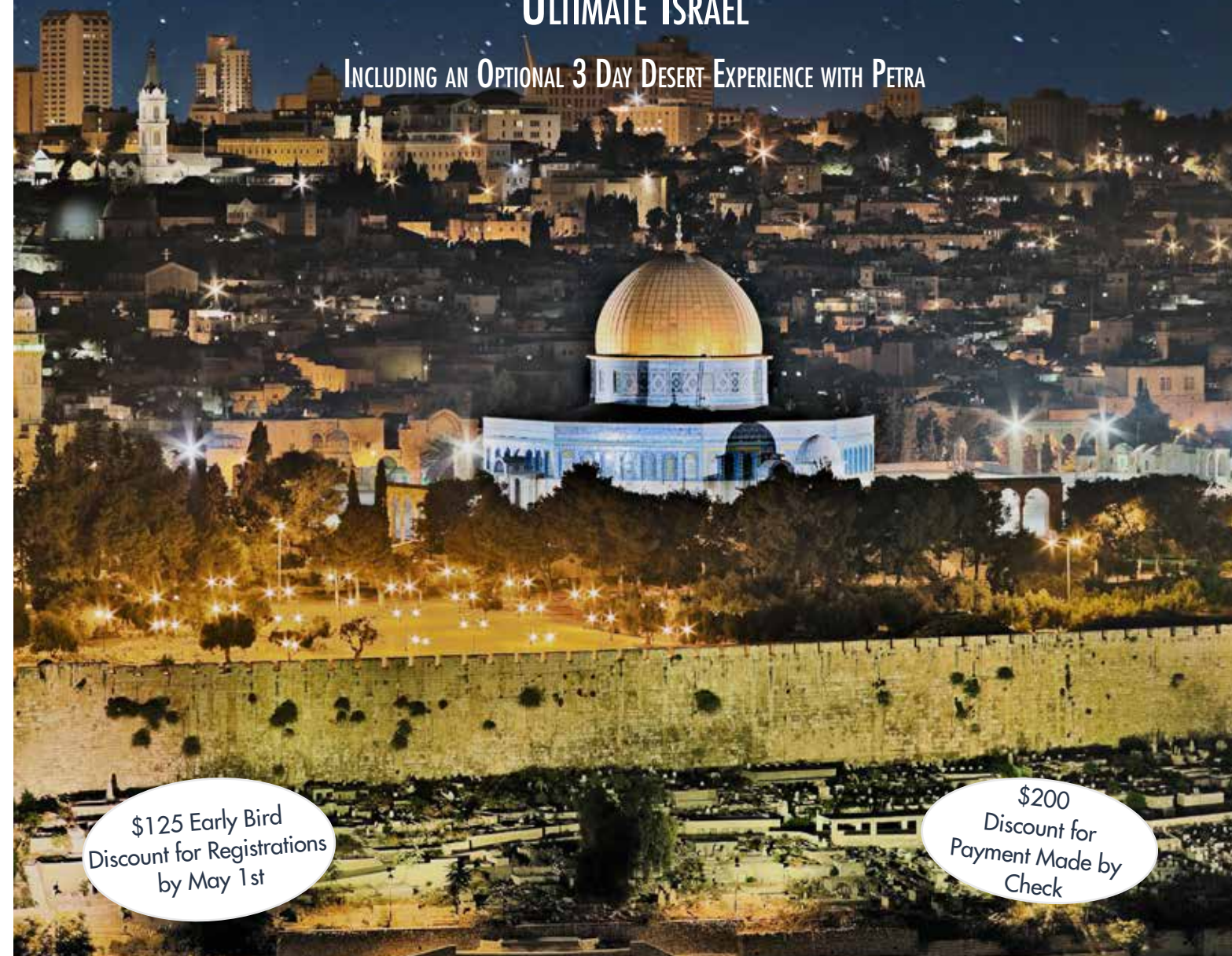

DAY BY DAY ITINERARY

AY 1 – MON. OCT. 17 – DEPART USA TO TEL AVIV

Our journey of a lifetime begins with departure on a United Airlines wide body jet. After take-off, we will be served dinner and breakfast en route.

DAY 2 – TUE. OCT. 18 – ARRIVE TEL AVIV / CAESAREA BY THE SEA



Upon arrival in Israel, we transfer by private motor coach to Caesarea by the Sea, the ancient seaport, built in honor of Caesar Augustus by Herod the Great and the Roman capital in the Holy Land for nearly 500 years. We view the Aqueduct and the majestic ruins of the city before we turn toward the Carlton Beach hotel in Tel Aviv on the

shores of the Mediterranean for dinner and overnight.

DAY 3 – WED. OCT. 19 – TEL AVIV / NAZARETH / SEPPHORIS / TIBERIAS

Each mile tells a story in our trip! We move on through the Carmel mountain range, where Elijah fought the prophets of Baal (1 Kings 18:1-40) to the ruins of Megiddo, where the layers of 26 civilizations have been uncovered. We look down on the Valley of Armageddon, when this period of world history concludes with the final battle (Revelation 16:16). Before lunch we head to Nazareth, the boyhood home of Jesus, the Church of the Annunciation. After lunch we stop at Sepphoris, one of the capital cities of Galilee, probably visited by Jesus. We turn east toward the Sea of Galilee and arrive at the U Boutique Hotel in Tiberias for dinner and overnight.

DAY 4 – THU. OCT. 20 – THE SEA OF GALILEE

Our day begins with a memorable boat ride on the Sea of Galilee. Today we follow some of the stories in Mark 4-6 about the ministry of Jesus. We move on to Capernaum, our Lord's hometown for two years (Matt. 4:13). We recall that eleven of the twelve apostles came from this region. A view of the Sea of Galilee from the Mt.



of Beatitudes is breathtaking. After a St. Peter's Fish lunch, we head to Hashlosa, near Gideon's spring for our baptism. Then we make a brief visit to Beit Shean and its 18 layers of civilization where Saul and his sons were nailed to the city wall (1 Sam. 31:10). Afterward we return to our hotel in Tiberias for dinner and overnight

DAY 5 – FRI. OCT. 21 – AROUND THE SEA OF GALILEE



After breakfast we climb through the Golan Heights where we arrive at the base of Mt. Hermon. We include a brief visit to tel Dan located near one of the three main sources for the Jordan River to see the ancient Canaanite gate and other ruins. Then we head to Caesarea Phillippi, where Peter made his great declaration about

Jesus (Mk. 8:27ff). When we approach Kuneitra, we are only 36 miles from Damascus, on the same road Saul of Tarsus used during his encounter with Christ (Acts 9:1-19). Later we stop at Kursi in the land of the Gadarenes, where Jesus is believed to have cast demons into a herd of swine (Mark 5:1-20). Our day concludes with visits to Chorazin, one of the three cities of the "Evangelical Triangle" and Magdala, with ruins of the first century fishing village, before we head to our hotel in Tiberias for dinner and overnight.

DAY 6 – SAT. OCT. 22 – NABLUS / JACOB'S WELL / JERUSALEM

An early walk along the shore provides a spectacular memory of sunrise over the Sea of Galilee. We say good-bye to the Sea of Galilee with an incredible view from Mt. Arbel, where Jews hid in caves following the conquest of Jerusalem in AD 70. From there we head South into the land of the Samaritans and ascend the winding road to Mount Gerizim, the Hill of Blessing (Deuteronomy 27) for a breathtaking view of Mount Ebal, the hill of curses. We stop for lunch on our way to Nablus where we visit Jacob's Well at Sychar, the site for the conversation of Jesus with the Samaritan woman (John 4). We enjoy dinner and overnight at the David Citadel Hotel in Jerusalem.

DAY 7 – SUN. OCT. 23 – BETHANY / MASADA / EIN GEDI / QUMRAN / DEAD SEA

We begin today at Bethany where Jesus raised Lazarus from the dead (John 11:17-44). We move on to Masada and climb into the cable car which takes us high above the wilderness mountain to the fortress built by King Herod. Here we survey the ruins of the fortifications, waterworks, synagogue, temples and palaces. After lunch we head back to Ein Gedi where David hid in a

cave from King Saul (1 Sam. 24:1). Later we stop at Qumran to understand the significance of the Dead Sea Scrolls before we conclude the day with a float in the Dead Sea. Dinner and overnight at our Jerusalem hotel.

DAY 8 – MON. OCT. 24 – JERUSALEM / CITY OF DAVID / PILGRIM'S PATH / MUSEUMS / RABBINICAL TUNNEL

Today our focus is on the Jewish history of the City of Jerusalem. Early in the morning, we enter the Old City through the Dung Gate and walk toward the Mughrabi Gate to the Temple Mount. The 35-acre Temple Mount is home to two of Islam's holiest sites—the Dome of the Rock and the Al Aqsa Mosque. The history of this area includes the sacrifice of Isaac (Gen. 22) and Jewish Temples built by Solomon and Herod. We exit the Temple Mount to visit the Pools of Bethesda, where Jesus healed the lame man (John 5) and the Church of St. Anne. We explore the City of David and walk the Pilgrim's Path on pavement that dates to the time of Christ. The Rockefeller Museum features excavations from this area and a visit to the Southern Steps. After lunch, we visit the Temple Treasures Institute, the home to vessels which can be used in a rebuilt Temple, then head to the Western Wall, the holiest place on earth



to modern Jews. Our day concludes with a walk through the Rabbinical Tunnel next to the Temple Mount where we wonder at the massive stones used for building the foundation for the Temple. We return to our hotel in Jerusalem for dinner and overnight.

DAY 9 – TUE. OCT. 25 – BETHLEHEM / MUSEUMS / EIN KAREM

Today we begin in Bethlehem to see the Church of Nativity, the oldest church in the Holy Land and built above caves believed to be where Jesus was born. We move on to the Shepherd's Fields to enjoy moments of worship remembering the 1st Christmas, before we drive up the Herodian and marvel at the opulence enjoyed by Herod the Great. After lunch, we visit Yad Vashem (The Holocaust Museum) to be reminded of the recent tragedies of Jewish people and the rebirth of the modern State of Israel. We move on to the Israel Museum where



replicas of the Dead Sea Scrolls are displayed, as well as an outdoor scale model of Jerusalem as it looked in Jesus' time. We conclude the day with a visit to Ein Karem, the traditional birthplace for John the Baptist and,

time-permitting, a drive to the Valley of Elah, where David fought Goliath. Dinner and overnight at our Jerusalem hotel.

DAY 10 – WED. OCT. 26 – OLD CITY OF JERUSALEM / FAREWELL DINNER

After breakfast we proceed to Gordon's Calvary and the Garden Tomb for communion and worship. We climb the Mt. of Olives a final time to the spot where Jesus ascended into heaven. We walk down to the Garden of Gethsemane & ponder the agony of the Lord before His crucifixion. We walk the Via Dolorosa, the "Way of Sorrows," before we come to the Church of the Holy Sepulcher, the traditional site for the burial and resurrection of the Lord. We can choose several optional experiences during our final afternoon in the Old City before we enjoy a private Middle Eastern dinner at the Ambassador Hotel in preparation for an evening departure for the airport.



DAY 11 – THU. OCT. 27 – ARRIVE USA

We arrive back in the U.S. and make our connecting flights full of memories of the Holy Land that will last a lifetime.
